TCA 49-1-614 states that "Each local board of education shall develop a policy by which student scores on the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program's grades three through eight (3-8) achievement tests shall comprise a percentage of the student's final grade for the spring semester in the subject areas of mathematics, reading/language arts, science and social studies. The percentage shall be determined by the local board from a range of no less than fifteen percent (15%) and no more than twenty-five percent (25%). The policy shall utilize performance levels determined by the State Board of Education and be developed and implemented for the spring semester of 2011."

In compliance with the amendment to Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 49, relative to student assessments, the following amendment is made to the grading system. Student scores on the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program's grades three through eight (3-8) achievement tests shall comprise a percentage of the student's final grade effective the spring semester of the 2010-2011 school year of fifteen percent (15%) in the subject areas of mathematics, reading/language arts, science and social studies. This policy utilizes the performance levels determined by the Tennessee State Board of Education.

END OF COURSE EXAMS

In compliance with requirements set forth by the Tennessee State Board of Education, the following policy is adopted for End of Course Exams for students in grades 9-12.

Beginning 2010-2011, the End of Course Exam administered by the Tennessee State Board of Education shall count twenty percent (20%) of the student's grade in the semester in which the test was taken in the respective subject. Beginning in 2011-2012 and there on, the End of Course Exam shall count twenty-five percent (25%) of the student's grade in the semester in which the test was taken in the respective subject.
